United Methodist, I am deeply rooted in Wesleyan theology. After graduating from high school, I went to school to be an accountant. A mission trip to Nicaragua changed my relationship with the business world. So I decided to become a high school history teacher. During my time studying to be a teacher, I worked as a camp counselor at Wanakee United Methodist Camp and Retreat Center in Meredith, NH.
