THANKSGIVING TURKEY BASKETS

It's that time of the year again!!

Once again, the Pantry will be handing out Thanksgiving turkey baskets to Plainville residents in need. These baskets will include all the fixings for a Thanksgiving meal and a frozen turkey.

- •Baskets will be distributed using a drivethrough format in the church parking lot on *Sunday, November 19th from 11 am to 12 noon*.
- •Signups for the baskets will be happening on Wednesday, October 18th and Wednesday, November 1st as part of the normal Pantry distribution (5:30 pm to 6:45 pm).
- •If there are extenuating circumstances, registered clients of the Pantry can sign up for a basket by calling the church office at 508-695-9587 between October 18th and November 1st.

VOLUNTEERING TO HELP WITH TURKEY BASKETS

If you have wanted to help out in the Food Pantry but haven't wanted to make an ongoing commitment, or if you've been wondering how volunteering at the Food Pantry works, or if you're

just never available on Wednesdays, helping out with Turkey Baskets is a great way to get a brief taste of what we do on a weekly basis.

* We will be doing most of the bag assembly for the Turkey Baskets on <u>Saturday, November 18th</u>

<u>between 10 am and 2 pm.</u> On Sunday morning, November 19th, final assembly will start at 10 am (*please do not come any earlier*), and distribution will start at 11 am.

Only adults (older than high school age) can help with distribution. Whether you have made Turkey Baskets for the last 20 years, or you didn't even know Turkey Baskets were a thing until 20 seconds ago, we would love to have your help!

If you would like to help out on either day (or both!), please contact Kathy Parker (<u>kap0405@gmail.com</u>) and let her know you're planning to be there. Even if you can only help for an hour, we would greatly appreciate it. *Many hands make light work!*

PANTRY DONATION UPDATES

We continue to appreciate donations of **cereal**, **boxed potatoes**, **and boxes or pouches of flavored rice or Minute rice**, as these things are difficult to get from the Greater Boston Food Bank (GBFB).

The following would be particularly helpful for the months of November and December:

Pasta Sauce
Hearty Soups (esp with beans)
Stews and Chilis

Please remember that donations of household items and non-perishable food can be left in the shed in the parking lot 24/7. You can also leave donations in the bin at the front of the store (near the registers) in the Plainville Stop and Shop.

PANTRY VOLUNTEER UPDATES

So Many THANKS to all of our dedicated, hard working volunteers! We are looking to add volunteers to join our team to unload the GBFB truck on the second Wednesday of each month; the truck comes around 12:30pm. Depending on how many people we have, it can take between 15 and 30 minutes of moving 15-30 pound cases of food to unload the truck. We have a dolly cart to help move the cases of food. As we come into the holiday season, it is a great time to think about how much we have to be thankful for. We are thankful for the great team of volunteers who work together every week to serve those in Plainville struggling with food insecurity and other financial challenges. We are thankful for all of the many area organizations who have contributed to the work of the Pantry; the Rotary Club, St. Martha's, the Jackson and Wood Schools, a number of KP clubs and organizations, and the Plainville Public Library are just some of the groups who give to the Pantry. We could not provide food for anyone without the generosity of so many here in Plainville who donate to the Food Pantry as individuals and families. The donation shed needs to be emptied almost daily, and the bin at Stop and Shop is emptied several times a week. Without these thoughtful and generous donations from all of you, we would not be able to help our neighbors in need. We are a small church and a small town, but our people have really big hearts. And for *that* we are very thankful!

More Winter Foods that are always in need:

Canned Beef or Chicken Stew Peanut Butter Jam/Jellies/Fluff Mac-n-Cheese

Boxed Potatoes – *Scalloped, Cheese-y, and instant potatoes, too.*

Flavored Rice – sm. boxed or pouches work best – flavored such as Spanish, Chicken, beef, Pilaf.

White or Brown Rice – *sm boxes or pouches work better than the larger bags.*

Canned or Pouches of Tuna Canned Chicken Cereals – Hot or Cold Spaghetti-O's with meatballs or franks Canned Beef Ravioli

Items we are in greater need of right now are highlighted in **BOLD.**

<u>BREAKFAST ITEMS</u> Hot or Cold Cereals – esp low or no sugar added. Breakfast Cereal Bars, Granola Bars. Quick Bread Mixes in Cranberry or Pumpkin.

LUNCH ITEMS Lrg and Small Peanut Butter, Jellies and Jams, Marshmallow Fluff, Canned Tuna, Canned Chicken, Spaghetti O's - esp w/ Meatballs or Franks, Canned Beef Ravioli and Beef-a-Roni, Canned Chili, Beef/Chicken Stew, Hearty Soups especially with Beans.

BEVERAGES Canned Coffee, Nonrefrigerated Juices – family sz bottles. Nonrefrigerated Parmalat Milk (in the canned milk aisle) family sz cartons and individual "juice box" sizes – White or Chocolate. Lemonade drink mixes.

FRUIT - Canned fruits <u>all packed in 100%</u> Juice and Applesauce (including No-Sugar added), Including snack cup sizes.

<u>CONDIMENTS</u> Mayo, Mustard, Ketchup, Relish, Pickles, Olives, BBQ Sauce. Salad Dressings – especially Ranch and Italian.

<u>SNACKS</u> Graham Crackers, All varieties of Crackers. Healthy Fruit Snacks & Trail mixes, dried fruits and nuts. Pudding Mixes, Jello Mixes. Chips, Pretzels, Popcorn, etc.

<u>SUPPER ITEMS</u> Boxed Mac-n-Cheese, Hamburger Helper (for Ground Beef, Chicken or Tuna), Pasta and Sauces including alfredo sauce, Pasta Salad Kits, Baked Beans, Sloppy Joe Sauce, Taco Kits, Boxed or Pouches of Instant Potatoes & Mixes (Mashed, Cheesy, Scalloped, etc), Rice – sm bx or pouches of white/brown. Rice mixes such as: Pilaf, Spanish, etc., Canned Veggies – all types.

<u>ALL TOILETRIES</u> - such as bars of bath soap, shampoo & hair conditioner, feminine hygiene products, toothpaste & toothbrushes, deodorant for men & women, disposable razors, shaving cream, Q-tips, lip balm, hand & body lotions, Gold Bond powders.

HOUSEHOLD ITEMS such as liquid dish soap (for washing dishes), dishwasher detergents, paper towels, 2-ply toilet paper, laundry detergent, dryer sheets, kitchen sponges, tissues.

MONETARY DONATIONS are greatly appreciated to help us buy food from the Greater Boston Food Bank at pennies on the dollar, stretching your donations.
